

DRIVE-THROUGH CELEBRATIONS END THE SCHOOL YEAR IN BRAZIL



EXPLORING POSSIBILITIES IN SERVICE OF LCWR MISSION



The Leadership of Women Religious has served religious communities for over 50 years, offering services to leadership groups, workshops, written materials and consultations and many opportunities for dialogue on important issues. Annual dues from member congregations assist in providing the funding necessary for these services, but LCWR also

seeks grants to help with expenses.

With great joy and deep appreciation to the Gerald and Henrietta Rauenhorst Foundation (GHR), LCWR announced that it received a grant in the amount of \$967,000 to further its mission and services to its members and to religious life of the whole. The 30-month exploratory grant supports a three-fold direction as LCWR continues to discern a future filled with hope.

The grant focuses on these areas:

- dismantling white privilege and racism at the organizational, systemic level
- furthering the national discernment on the emergent future of religious life
- continuing efforts towards national and international collaboration for mission and religious life.

The grant spans the timeframe of January 2021 – June 2023.

LCWR worked with CARA, a research organization to look at the demographics of congregations in the United States. Our congregation will be utilizing some of the resources of LCWR from this study in our next General Chapter Preparation Meeting on February 13. So, please mark your calendar!
